Join us for the 17th Prayer Vigil for the Earth, next to the Washington Monument off Constitution Ave between 15th and 17th Streets NW from sunrise Saturday, Oct 10 to mid-afternoon Sunday, Oct. 11. Experience a spirit-stirring, heart-stirring, mindful and joyful celebration of life as people from all over from a great array of traditions come together to share prayers, ceremonies, songs and music in celebration of the Earth. All are invited! Come by for awhile – or stay.

The host tradition of this amazing event is Native American, joined by spiritual leaders and representatives from major faiths and many spiritual beliefs and anyone who wants to be part of this magical, exhilarating and peaceful experience. Since its founding in 1993, the Vigil has grown tremendously. Participants include indigenous traditions from North and Central America; Buddhists; Tibetan Buddhists; Christians; Jains; Hindus; Muslim; members of Shinji Shumeikai; Sikhs, members of the Yoruba tradition; and other faiths and cultures.
